Whether you are an undergraduate or postgraduate student, working whilst at university will benefit you in a number of ways, providing an opportunity to:

- Improve your English language skills
- Learn new skills for your future career
- Get an insight into the UK working culture
- Meet new people/make friends
- Gain experience to enhance your CV

How many hours can I work whilst in the UK?

Generally, for most international students the following rules apply regarding eligibility to work in the UK:

- No more than 20 hours a week during term time
- Full-time during vacations
- A work placement as part of your course, providing it does not amount to more than 50% of the course
- Working as a Student Union sabbatical officer for up to two years

National Insurance Number

This is a unique personal number which is used to record your National Insurance (NI) contributions. You must obtain one in order to work in the UK. You can apply for an NI number by calling the National Insurance number application line on 0800 141 2079. You may be required to attend an interview and show documents such as your passport/birth certificate. Full details are available online from:
